PRIMARY CARE PCN DES WEBINAR

CMCA are hosting two duplicate webinars to outline the requirements of the updated Early Cancer Diagnosis element of the 2023/24 PCN DES. This webinar is open to clinical and non-clinical Primary Care colleagues and takes place on 23rd and 24th May at 13:00. We will share relevant initiatives and highlight support available to help Primary Care colleagues with delivery.

CERVICAL SCREENING QUESTIONNAIRE

Following a recent review of gynaecological cancers, CMCA have set up a working group to support with addressing the issues relating to cervical cancer. A programme of work is being set up, which includes understanding workforce capacity for undertaking screening in GP practices. The questionnaire, accessible here, will only take 10-15 minutes to complete and will support us with increase screening participation.

GENOMICS UPDATES

As part of the NHSE commitment to implement Lynch Syndrome pathways for screening and surveillance of both colorectal and endometrial cancers, a national project was set up to support the standardisation of testing, equity of access and training. Online training for primary care clinicians is available here.

The North West Genomic Medicine Service Alliance have organised a number of roadshows during May, June & July to share where genomics is being embedded into routine healthcare locally and across the North West. More information can be found here.
